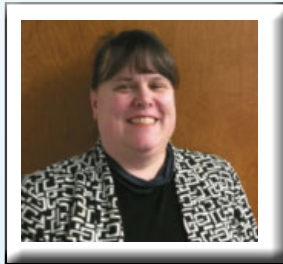

SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING

Supported Decision-Making is an approach that encourages individuals with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) to make their own life decisions with support from family, friends, and trusted individuals.

Parents of children with I/DD frequently wonder what will happen to their son or daughter when they are gone, and how important decisions about their lives will be made. Supported Decision-Making allows people with I/DD to receive the support they need and want to understand the situations and choices they face while maintaining control of their rights.

What is Work Incentives Planning and Assistance (WIPA)?

WIPA is a step by step process to assist people with disabilities, receiving benefits from Social Security, with understanding how employment will affect their Medicare, Medicaid, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and other benefits they may receive. WIPA also helps beneficiaries to understand how they can increase their financial independence.

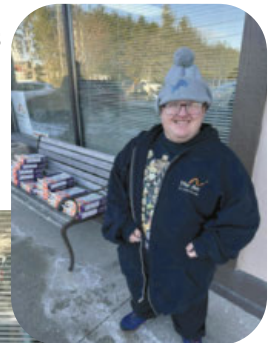

Thank you to all who bought pies this year at our Annual Achatz Pie Sale! We sold a total of 175 pies which gave us a profit of \$875!

Learn more about What The Arc Is Doing

The Arc at a National Level does more than you realize to help consumers with IDD disabilities. As a local chapter of The Arc we have the backing of a powerful organization that fights for the big items all of our consumers need to live a healthy, happy and productive life. When you donate to The Arc at a National level it benefits every chapter across the United States. Below is just a few of the areas they are working on right now. Find out more at www.thearc.org.

- **Education** - While legislation like the IDEA and ADA were huge victories for the disability community, we must continue to fight to ensure proper implementation and enforcement. When Congress first passed the IDEA, it intended to fully fund the law at 40 percent of the additional cost of educating students with disabilities. However, federal funding has never even reached half of that amount, leaving it to states and localities to try to make up the difference. The Arc continues to advocate for the government to meet the full funding amount.

- **Direct Support Professionals** - The Arc advocates for improvements in several areas to address this crisis that impacts the independence of people with IDD. The Arc's Coalition Work: The CCD Long Term Services and Supports Task Force works on issues relevant to the DSP workforce crisis, including how a comprehensive system of long term supports and services must address DSP issues.

- **Employment, Training & Wages** - People with IDD should have the supports necessary from individuals and systems to enable them to find and keep community jobs based on their preferences, interests, and strengths, work alongside people without disabilities, receive comparable wages, and be free from workplace discrimination. The Arc's Coalition Work: The CCD Employment and Training Task Force works on issues relevant to the employment of people with disabilities, including best practices, school-to-work transition, training of staff and people with IDD, and systems.

Here at the local level we receive phone calls every day from families looking for information on how to find the help they need for their ID/D loved ones and we are here to help. Whether you need a question answered, need to know where to go to get something done or need us to help you one on one with paperwork or a meeting. The Arc of SCC is here to help. If we don't have

the answer we will find the answer for you. **Find out more at www.thearc.org!**

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED - IDD CONSUMERS CAN HELP

Volunteering is an important part of community life. Every day, Americans spend time and energy making a difference in their communities. Inclusive volunteering is about making sure everyone can give back.

People with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) can serve their communities in many ways:

- Serving meals at soup kitchens • Stocking food pantries • Preparing and delivering meals to seniors
- Helping keep communities beautiful • Spending time with people who are isolated • Helping care for pets and other animals

Why It Matters

Sometimes, people with IDD do not have as many opportunities to volunteer in the community as they would like. This may happen for several reasons:

- Some people think that people with disabilities can only receive service and cannot give back to others.
- Volunteer groups and coordinators may not have experience working with people with IDD and may not know how or have enough staff to support them to volunteer.
- Volunteer locations may not be accessible to people with IDD.
- A person with IDD may need support with health needs while they volunteer.
- People may struggle to find transportation to or from a volunteering.
- People with IDD may not know how to express their interest in volunteering or where to find volunteer opportunities in their community.
- People with IDD may not want to volunteer because they want a paid job.
- Many people perceive people with disabilities as the ones in need of service. However, people with disabilities are a key part of civic engagement across the country.

People volunteer every day to build confidence, job skills, and work experience. Volunteering helps job seekers network and build relationships that can lead to employment. It also provides chances to build friendships and networks of support.

**People can and should be empowered to give back to their communities. When everyone participates, it's a win-win!
