Why and When to Call 988 republished from The Arc National Newsletter

A mental health crisis deserves a mental health response. The same is true for people with IDD. 988 is the new three-digit phone number to call for help during mental health and substance use crisis situations, and it will be available nationwide by July 2022. Then, all phone companies will route 988 calls to call centers, either locally (if available) or national hubs.

While this number is called the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and will serve people with mental health or substance use disorder disabilities, this is also an opportunity to advocate for needed crisis services for people with IDD and people with co-occurring IDD and mental health disabilities (often called dual diagnosis). Approximately **30 to 40% of people with IDD also have a mental health condition** and sometimes communicate overwhelming feelings through "challenging behaviors." This can lead to inappropriate and costly stays in psychiatric hospitals or jail.

How Can 988 Help People with IDD? 988 call centers could divert many calls from 911 and law enforcement, instead routing them to mental health crisis professionals. People with disabilities account for one-third to one-half of all people killed by law enforcement. More than half of Black people with a disability have been arrested by the time they turn 28.

However, to fully support this approach, communities will need to link the call centers with mobile crisis teams, develop a peer suupport workforce and open respite centers for de-escalation needs. Funding is needed at the state and federal levels to achieve this goal.

988 can be a game changer for people with IDD and other disabilities if they are included in the implementation of hotline and community-based support services. This means it is very important for people with disabilities and especially people of color with disabilities, to advocate for crisis care. Contact your federal, state and local legislators to find out how our state is preparing for this moment!



Providing information to people with disabilities about how earnings from work affect their Social Security and other public benefits.

What is Work Incentives Planning and Assistance (WIPA)?

WIPA is a step by step process to assist people with disabilities, receiving benefits from Social Security, with understanding how employment will affect their Medicare, Medicaid, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and other benefits they may receive. WIPA also helps beneficiaries to understand how they can increase their financial independence.



People with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) can serve their communities in many ways:

- · Serving meals at soup kitchens,
- · Stocking food pantries,
- Preparing and delivering meals to seniors,
- Helping keep communities beautiful,
- Spending time with people who are isolated,
- Helping care for pets and other animals, and more.

Why It Matters


Sometimes, people with IDD do not have as many opportunities to volunteer in the community as they would like. This may happen for several reasons:

- Some people think that people with disabilities can only receive service and cannot give back to others.
- · Volunteer groups and coordinators may not have experience working with people with IDD and may not know how or have enough staff to support them to volunteer.
 - Volunteer locations may not be accessible to people with IDD.
 - A person with IDD may need support with health needs while they volunteer.
 - People may struggle to find transportation to or from a volunteering.
 - People with IDD may not know how to express their interest in volunteering or where to find volunteer opportunities in their community.
 - People with IDD may not want to volunteer because they want a paid job.
- Many people perceive people with disabilities as the ones in need of service. However, people with disabilities are a key part of civic engagement across the country.

People volunteer every day to build confidence, job skills, and work experience. Volunteering helps job seekers network and build relationships that can lead to employment. It also provides chances to build friendships and networks of support.

People can and should be empowered to give back to their communities. When everyone participates, it's a win-win!
